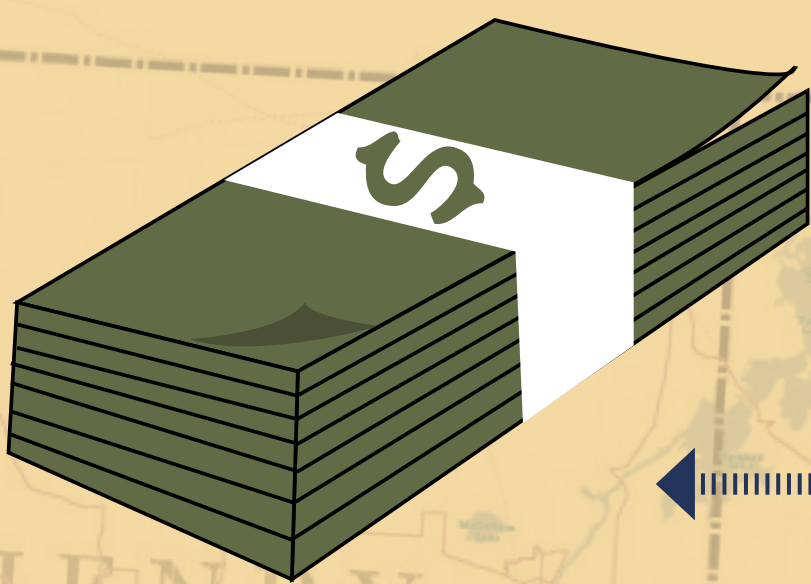


Top Ten Benefits

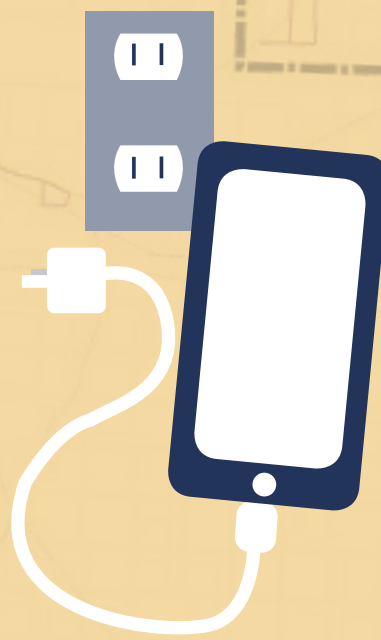
