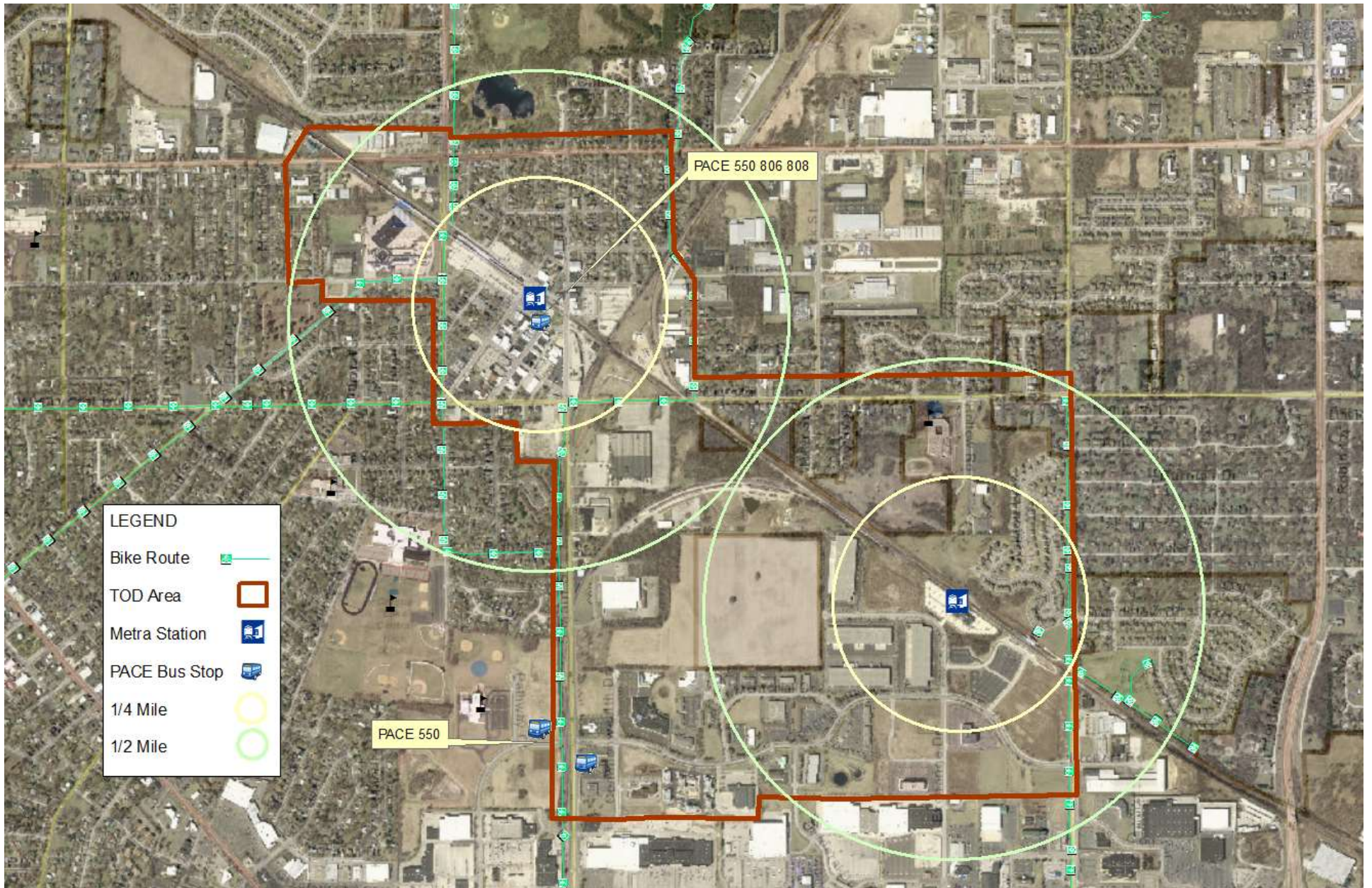

This letter is to express Metra's support for the City of Crystal Lake's 2018 application to the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) Community Planning and Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) Local Technical Assistance grant programs. The City is requesting funding to develop a TOD plan for a study area encompassing both Metra stations (Crystal Lake and Pingree Road) within their city limits.

Metra supports this request for funding to increase transit-supportive land uses around their Metra stations through their goal to discover housing densities and the appropriate land use mix that would support these existing transit services. Metra also supports their goal to be advised on how to increase access to the transit system through improvements to the amenities or infrastructure that will result in an increase in transit use.

Metra anticipates that this project would result in benefits for existing Metra riders and attract new riders to the Crystal Lake and Pingree Road Metra stations. We therefore would recommend its consideration for Community Planning/Local Technical Assistance Program funding. If this project is selected, Metra staff looks forward to participating in the study's steering committee as technical advisors. Note that Metra support for the implementation of the outcomes of this study depends on the results of the study and is subject to future funding availability.
